ADJECTIVE+LY = ADVERB

quick-quickly slow-slowly heavy-heavily bad-badly soft-softly
beautiful-beautifully careful-carefully clear-clearly short-shortly



These words are both adjectives and adverbs, so we don't add -ly at the end of them.

hard fast early late
"good" becomes "well"
I am a good student.
I do my homework well.

Adverbs are words that tell you how something happens or how someone does something.
She opened the door slowly.
The wind was blowing softly.
Our dog barked very loudly.
Helen went out happily.
The singer sang beautifully.

Adjectives are words that modify a noun. Adjectives usually say how something is or what something is like.

He is an honest boy.
His car is really fast.
We have got a big house.
